

Quality – We implement the highest standards and techniques so that we always deliver transformational instruction and guidance to Maydm's students.


Boldness – We have an energetic and exciting work environment that requires a blend of technical acumen and creative vision, so we welcome collaboration that is both forthright and pioneering.

What a year it has been here for us at Maydm! It has been the greatest joy leading an incredible team and students and seeing our mission flourish.

2019 has been an exciting year of growth and celebration for Maydm and we're excited to share some of that with you. This would not have been possible without all of the generous support from our community. Over the course of the year, Maydm grew immersive programs in length, depth, and number. We had our first ever high school immersive program and began to pair students with a mentor for a full year.

Our job is to ensure students have the support, exposure, and boldness to pursue those passions and forge their own path in tech. Maydm aims to be a resource and a path to growth for students who have been continually underrepresented in tech, and this year we continued to do just that. Our students are brilliant - they are our future engineers, developers, innovators, and professors.

Going into the year, we had a dream to grow, and the community and our partners helped us achieve those dreams. We were honored to have our work celebrated in several different ways this year. In 2019, Maydm was recognized with the Force for Positive Change award, Madison Magazine M List and I was named a Forbes 30 Under 30 Social Entrepreneur. As we look forward to 2020, we are excited to celebrate our 5 year anniversary and see our students soar to even greater heights.

Throughout each of Maydm's Immersive Summer programs, students not only learned a variety of valuable technical knowledge, but they also worked with mentors from the tech field and went on STEM exposure field trips to companies around the area.

The Wonderful World of Web Development

Students learned the programming languages of the web, including HTML, CSS, and Javascript, by building a portfolio of websites and web-based games.

Madison: 100% of students felt confident in their ability to learn new things at the end of the program and 81% reported to be makers, not just users of technology.
Milwaukee: Our all-girl cohort from the Boys and Girls Club of Greater Milwaukee joined us for the two-week version of this program, {Dev}Girls. Half of the students reported an increased desire to work in STEM fields and 75% of students indicated that they want to continue learning how to code on their own.

Appetite for App Development

Maydm hosted our first immersive program for high school students in partnership with Madison College. Over the course of the five-week program, Madison-area students quickly learned Java, the preferred programming language of many Fortune 500 enterprises, and then used that knowledge to develop their own Android apps with Android Studio.

- 88% said they liked or loved STEM, up from 55% before the program.
- 75% of students said they were likely or very likely to pursue advanced STEM classes in school.

Brandon (15) said he "wanted to learn new skills instead of just having a job at Culver's, and I certainly did that. I want to have a career in robotics and continue learning to code." Following our program, Brandon enrolled in AP Computer Science and also was admitted to Madison College's STEM Academy




















M2E2

On December 7, Maydm hosted *Maydm's Maker's Epic Experience* at Epic in Verona. There was a Middle School session in the morning, followed by a High School session in the afternoon. Nearly 100 students learned how to program Micro:bit tiny computers and code their own 3D interactive stories. They shared a meal together, worked one on one with professionals in the tech sector, and learned about life at Epic while touring the Deep Space building.

MISS

Throughout the fall of 2019, Maydm introduced **Maydm's Innovation Studio Sessions** as whole-day workshops to introduce students to a variety of introductory coding concepts. These sessions took place at local companies and enabled students to learn about web design, app development, robotics, and hardware programming.

Centro Hispano

In 2019, Maydm joined Centro Hispano's Escalera Program at Madison East and West High Schools for 10 sessions to teach students coding concepts after school.

Badger Rock Middle School

During the 1st semester of the 2019-20 school year, Maydm worked closely with Badger Rock Middle School to host a weekly coding class. Two classes of middle school students learned all about hardware programming, robotics, and more!

Wisconsin Institute of Discovery

Over the summer Maydm hosted 4 sessions with the Wisconsin Institute for Discovery at the University of Wisconsin-Madison where students learned how to build websites.

Wisconsin Youth Company

Maydm worked with Wisconsin Youth Company to host a series of week long summer programs where students learned about hardware programming and web development.

STEaM Summit for Girls

Maydm worked with Rockwell Automation to host a session at the Milwaukee Business Journal STEaM Summit for Girls in Milwaukee where girls learned introductory coding concepts using apps.








"I want to make an app that will be able to help people with their emotions and be able to calm them down or get them in contact with a therapist or something like that."


